### School Facts

Mayde Creek High School is a public, four-year secondary school with an enrollment of 2970 in grades nine through twelve. The senior class has 706 students. The teaching faculty is composed of 250 personnel. Mayde Creek High School is accredited by the Texas Education Agency and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and is part of the Katy Independent School District. The U.S. Department of Education has awarded Mayde Creek High School the Drug-Free School Award. Mayde Creek also won the Texas and National Blue Ribbon School Award. The school day consists of seven class periods, one being an optional study hall. Classes meet five days a week for 50 minutes. The school year is divided into two semesters with three six-weeks marking periods in each one.

### Class rank is based on the cumulative grade point average for grades 9-12 as well as high school courses taken in Jr. High.

A student's grade point average is determined by dividing the total number of grade points by the number of semester courses attempted.

### Highest GPA in 2019

**4.7903**

A full-year, one period course consisting of two semesters is assigned the value of one credit toward the graduation requirements. A one semester course receives one-half credit. Students are classified by the number of credits they have earned at the beginning of the school year as designated by state law.
